RURAL COMMUNITIES IN THE LEPHALALE AREA TO ACESS LAND CLAIMS PROCESSS

The Office of the Regional Land Claims Commissioner: Limpopo, in partnership with Lephalale local municipality is to embark on a public information drive spreading the message on the reopening of land claims and the availability of mobile lodgement offices to prospective claimants targeting far flung villages in Lephalale.

The commission visited the Steenbokpan area on Saturday 7 November 2015 as part of the awareness campaign and in preparation of future visits by the mobile lodgement bus to Steenbokpan and other remote areas in the Lephalale region.

President Jacob Zuma has, in terms of section 84(2)(a) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, assented to the Restitution of Land Rights Amendment Act. The Act now provides for the re-opening of the lodgement of land claims by people who missed the 31 December 1998 deadline to lodge land claims. The lodgement of land claims shall take place over a period of five years, ending on 30 June 2019

The Constitution provides that persons and communities that lost their land, after 19 June 1913, as a result of past racially discriminatory laws or practices are entitled to restitution or equitable redress. The re-opening of lodgment of land claims enables those that did not lodge claims before 31 December 1998 to do so.
