FREEDOM DAY CELEBRATION AT MOLEMOLE



Hundreds of community members from different parts of Limpopo gathered at Bakenberg Stadium for the annual Freedom Day Celebration on 27 April 2019. Limpopo Premier together with the minister of Sports, Arts and Culture, Mme Thokozile Xasa, were joined by MEC's, Mayors and other distinguished delegates.

The purpose of the day was to celebrate25 years of democracy and also to commemorate the first democratic elections in South Arica which were held on 27 April 1994. According to the Premier, the 1994 election abolished apartheid and ushered in a new hope, a new dawn which is democracy.

The Premier used the opportunity to outline some of the achievements of the current government such as the construction of hospitals and clinics, roads, access to education, schools etc. He also acknowledged that backlog and challenges of service delivery in some areas of Limpopo and gave assurance that Limpopo Government will continue work hard to ensure that service delivery is fast-tracked. Mathabatha further urged the youth to make use of the opportunities given to them to go to school and get educated in order honour struggle heroes and heroine who were tortured and killed for South Africa to attain democracy "Black children were only given the education which prepared them to work as servants of their white counterparts.



This type of education was known as Bantu education. When young people protested and rejected Bantu education, the apartheid government responded by sending the police to shoot and kill them. One of the youngest victims who were killed by apartheid police for rejecting Bantu education was the 11 year old Hector Peterson. Bantu education was designed to ensure that Black children do not get the opportunities to be trained as medical specialists, scientists, accountants and other professions. important The apartheid government wanted our kids to go to school only to be trained how to become a good garden boy or an effective kitchen girl".

PHAHLADIRA WATER PROJECT AND ELECTRIFICATION SOD TURNING

The project involves the installation of electricity to more than thirty houses.
