Our national government continues to

make improvements in the turnaround time for the issuing of water licenses.

This will further improve the investment climate in our area.

Council is currently investigating the possibility of establishing a development agency which, if established, will focus on creating conducive conditions for investors and economic development.

The National Infrastructure Plan aims to support the integration of African economies and the development of intra-Africa regional value chains.

Investing in Lephalale is therefore very strategic because the municipality shares a border with our neighbouring Botswana, which is a corridor to Zambia, DRC and parts of Namibia and Zimbabwe.
