INTRODUCTION OF CONTRACTORS FOR WATER PROJECTS AND THE ASSESMENT AND COMPILATION OF THE TECHNICAL REPORT FOR VIP TOILETS AT VARIOUS VILLAGES

As part of accelerating service delivery, Lephalale Local Municipality Speaker Cllr Grace Marakalala accompanied by other Councillors and officials embarked on projects handover meetings to the three traditional authorities at Ga-Seleka, Mokuruanyane and Shongoane villages on 20 February 2025.

The meetings were aimed at introducing various service providers that have been appointed to conduct an assessment and compile technical report, planning, design, project management and commissioning of project for Ga-seleka Water Scheme, to conduct an assessment and compile technical report, planning, design, project management and commissioning for Shongoane water scheme, to conduct assessment and compile technical report for VIP Toilets and Backlog Verification in the rural villages and to Construct Mokuruanyane and Shongoane Regional Water Scheme Project Phase 5-(Resuscitation of a Stalled Project Since 2015/2016 Financial Year)

The VIP sanitation project will be implemented in all the rural villages to eradicate the backlog. The community will be provided with ventilated improved pit latrines that will be able to be maintained and the fecal sludge treatment plant will be constructed at a central point for collection of all generated fecal sludge from various villages.

The Technical reports for both Ga-Seleka and Shongoane Water Schemes will encompass the scope of work for provision of adequate water supply to the rural communities.

Communities will benefit because field workers will be appointed on the VIP project to collect backlog verification data. The Mokuruanyane and Shongoane Regional Water Scheme projects will create approximately 50 Jobs to the local community in the villages where the project will be implemented.

The assessment report for the VIP toilets will encompass the technical solutions for a safe
