"The objective of this summit is to develop local young entrepreneurs who are more entrepreneurial, more adventurous, better educated and economically innovative. We want Lephalale local municipality to develop the youth who will use the advantages of the imperatives of progressive policies such as the National Development Plan (NDP).

The National Youth Development Agency's Mmathapelo Maepa said she appreciates the initiative by the Municipality as it will unlock a process of engagements with the local youth to empower them "The NYDA is readily available at all times to provide services such as skills development, registration of corporatives and grant funding". Eskom's representative Thomas Chauke equipped delegates with information on tendering processes.

Delegates at the summit formed three commissions which discussed:

- Support towards black owned small businesses in government and private sector.
- Revitalizing Lephalale manufacturing and agricultural sector
