# LEPHALALE INTEGRATED SERVICE DELIVERY WEEK

01 JULY 2025


On 01 July 2025, the Executive Mayor of Waterberg District, Councillor Jack Maeko, together with the Mayor of Lephalale Municipality, Councillor Aaron Mokgetle, officially launched the Integrated Service Delivery Week at Lebu Sports Ground. This initiative is a strategic campaign aimed at enhancing the accessibility of essential government services to local communities.

Over the course of the week, various government departments, including Home Affairs, Health, Social Development, Employment and Labour, Forestry and Fisheries, as well as the National Youth Development Agency, provided their services directly on site. This collaborative effort seeks to improve service delivery by facilitating streamlined access to public employment services and fostering partnerships among different government entities and stakeholders to offer comprehensive support.

In his opening remarks, Mayor Aaron Mokgetle emphasized that this initiative strongly aligns with the District Development Model (DDM), as it accelerates and integrates service delivery across multiple spheres of government, thereby promoting cohesive development.

Executive Mayor Jack Maeko highlighted that the week-long programme aims to address critical challenges such as illegal dumping, water and sanitation issues, electricity provision, and road infrastructure. He expressed confidence that these concerns will be effectively mitigated through the Integrated Service Delivery Week.

The day commenced with a courtesy visit to the Seleka Traditional Council. The mayors were accompanied by the Speaker of Council, Councillor Grace Marakalala, the Chief Whip of Waterberg District Municipality, Councillor Bennet Monare, as well as Councillor Jan Selolo, underscoring the collaborative spirit of the initiative.









# SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING

### 02 July 2025

On 02 July 2025, the Speaker of the Lephalale Local Municipality Council, Councillor Grace Marakalala, convened a special council meeting conducted virtually. The meeting addressed several critical administrative and financial matters, with a primary focus on the appointment of senior municipal officials as follows:

- Ms. Feziwe Nogilana-Raphela as Municipal Manager.
- Ms. Lesego Matlwa as Chief Financial Officer (CFO)
- Mr. Kgoroshi Motebele as Director of Social Services

The Mayor, Councillor Aaron Mokgetle, formally presented the appointment reports to the Council for approval and extended his congratulations to the newly appointed officials.

Furthermore, the Mayor underscored key priorities for the new leadership, including:

### 03 July 2025

The Limpopo Economic Development, Environment and Tourism Department (LEDET), in strategic partnership with the Local Economic Development (LED) Unit of Lephalale Local Municipality and the Waterberg District Municipality, has launched a collaborative Economic Empowerment Outreach Program in Lephalale on 03 July 2025.

This initiative is designed to enhance economic participation by increasing awareness, promoting regulatory compliance, and facilitating market access for businesses primarily situated in townships and rural communities. The program seeks to empower these enterprises by connecting them with critical resources and opportunities to support sustainable growth.

A stakeholder engagement session was convened at the Lephalale Municipal Lapa, which brought together key government entities committed to the program's objectives.

These included: The Department of Small Business Development (DSBD), providing support through initiatives such as the Township and Rural Entrepreneurship Programme (TREP), Spaza Shop funding, and other financial assistance schemes, Small Enterprise Development Agency (SEDA), offering asset financing and skills development programs tailored to emerging businesses, South African Revenue Service (SARS), facilitating compliance with tax and regulatory requirements, Provincial Treasury, responsible for enabling access to government procurement opportunities and Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (BBBEE) initiatives targeted at the beneficiary group.

# OVERSIGHT VISIT TO ALTOOSTYD AND MARAPONG ICRUI


### 03 July 2025

The Limpopo MEC for Cooperative Governance, Human Settlement and Traditional Affairs, Mr. Basikopo Makamu, together with the Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, conducted an oversight visit to the Altoostyd and Marapong Community Residential Unit (CRU) projects on 03 July 2025.

These two developments are

integral to the government's ongoing commitment to ensuring adequate housing for all citizens, as outlined in Section 25 of the Constitution. The projects aim to provide secure and affordable accommodation for low-income individuals who are unable to access formal private rental and social housing markets, thereby addressing critical housing needs within the community











## MANDELA DAY ACTIVITIES

#### 22 July 2025

On 22 July 2025, the community of Lebu in Limpopo came together to observe Mandela Day, honouring the legacy of Nelson Mandela. The event was attended by prominent leaders including Limpopo Premier Dr. Phophi Ramathuba, Deputy Minister of International Relations and Cooperation Ms. Thandi Moraka, South Korean Ambassador to South Africa Mr. Dong-Han Yang, Executive Mayor of Waterberg District Municipality Councillor Jack Maeko, and Mayor of Lephalale Municipality Councillor Aaron Mokgetle.

The day commenced with a formal courtesy visit to the Seleka Traditional Council by the

two Mayors, accompanied by the Speakers of both municipalities, Councillor Grace Marakalala and Councillor Mabu Gumede, as well as the Chief Whip of Waterberg Municipality, Councillor Bennet Monare.

The delegation then proceeded to the Phetogo Drop-In Centre in Sefitlhogo Village to partake in the Nelson Mandela Month commemoration activities. At the centre, they engaged in community upliftment projects including the planting of vegetables and the distribution of essential goods such as 300 pairs of school shoes, groceries, 30 blankets, 15 mattresses, and 100 sewing machines to support vulnerable community members.

Further contributions included the donation of 10 pieces of ICT equipment to Ramakwapeng Primary School and the provision of groceries valued at R10,000, along with the installation of a fence at Ramoleke Crèche in Lebu Village.

This year's Mandela Month was observed under the theme: "It is in our hands to combat poverty and inequality", Premier Dr. Ramathuba's active participation underscores the Limpopo Provincial Government's ongoing commitment to harnessing Mandela Month as a platform to drive sustainable development and transformative change, particularly in rural and disadvantaged communities.











### MAYOR RECEIVES MEMORANDUM

### **Mayor Engages with Lephalale Community Forum on Municipal Concerns**

22 July 2025

On 22 July 2025, the Lephalale Community Forum Task Team (LCFTT) formally presented a memorandum of demands to Mayor Councillor Aaron Mokgetle, articulating community concerns relating to several municipal service delivery and administrative issues.

The memorandum outlined key demands, including:

 Cancellation of debt, an immediate waiver of outstanding municipal debts incurred by residents, attributed to incorrect billing practices and unjustified charges.



- Electricity deduction: the removal of the 30% electricity deduction currently applied to purchases.
- Accurate metering and billing: implementation of an improved meter reading and billing system to ensure accuracy and prevent future discrepancies.
- Public accountability: a call for transparency and accountability from the revenue management team regarding municipal financial practices.

In response, Mayor Mokgetle acknowledged the issues raised and assured the community that the municipality is committed to resolving these matters responsibly.

He has convened a special meeting with municipal management to explore potential solutions and to establish appropriate remedial actions. It is important to highlight that the Lephalale Local Municipality continues to prioritize service excellence and good governance, as reflected in its Integrated Development Plan (IDP) processes that actively involve community participation and stakeholder engagement.



### ORDINARY COUNCIL SITTING







### 29 JULY 2025

Lephalale Local Municipality convened its Ordinary Council Meeting on 29 July 2025, under the leadership of Speaker Councillor Grace Marakalala. During this session, several significant matters were deliberated upon and approved, as outlined below:

- Report on Ward Committee Functionality: The Council reviewed the operational effectiveness of the 15 ward committees. These committees are instrumental in fostering community engagement and ensuring active participation of residents in the municipality's decision-making processes.
- Financial Report: The financial performance report as of 30 June 2025 was presented, offering a detailed overview of the municipality's fiscal position. The report identified key areas of strength as well as those requiring targeted improvements.
- Cost Recovery and Revenue Collection: The fourth quarterly report on cost recovery and revenue collection was examined.

The discussion focused on strategies aimed at optimizing revenue generation and minimizing operational costs within the municipality.

- Unauthorized, Irregular, and Fruitless Expenditure: A
  comprehensive report on instances of unauthorized, irregular, and
  fruitless expenditure was submitted. The report emphasized the
  need for enhanced financial governance to prevent such
  occurrences and to improve overall fiscal responsibility.
- Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and Performance Management System (PMS) Process Plan: The Council endorsed the IDP/PMS Process Plan for the 2026/27 financial year. This plan establishes the framework for integrated development planning and performance management going forward.

The meeting was attended by municipal councillors, Directors, and other officials. Additionally, former Councillor and Speaker of the Council, Ms. Rosina Boloka-Thobane, was present as a special guest in the gallery

# INTRODUCTION OF CONTACTOR FOR SHONGOANE 1 ACCESS ROAD REHABILITATION PROJECT



#### 30 JULY 2025

The Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, Councillor Aaron Mokgetle, together with municipal councillors and officials, officially introduced the appointed contractor for the reconstruction and rehabilitation of the Shongoane 1 access road on 30th July 2025. This initiative underscores the municipality's dedication to accelerating service delivery and maintaining high-quality road infrastructure within the Lephalale area.

The project, which has received strong support from the traditional authorities and the Shongoane community, encompasses the following key details:

- Project Overview Road Length: 1.4 kilometres Scope of Work: Rehabilitation involving the removal of existing paving blocks and replacement with new 80 mm paving blocks to ensure a smoother driving surface.
- Project Duration: The rehabilitation is expected to be completed within six months.
- Employment: The project will create temporary employment for 15 workers over the course of the construction period.
- Current Project Status Earthworks: The earthworks phase has been successfully completed. The focus will now shift towards rehabilitating the existing road surface rather than full reconstruction. The upgraded surface will carry a warranty of 15 years.
- Additional Infrastructure Improvements Stormwater Management: Rehabilitation of the 'V' drain will be undertaken to improve stormwater drainage and effectively manage runoff in the area.

This road rehabilitation project reaffirms the municipality's commitment to improving transportation infrastructure, enhancing community accessibility, and promoting sustainable development in Lephalale.

## INTRODUCTION OF MARAPONG ACCESS ROAD CONTRACTORS

### 31 July 2025

On 31 July 2025, the Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, Councillor Aaron Mokgetle, accompanied by municipal councillors and officials, officially introduced two significant access road projects in Marapong township.

These road infrastructure developments form part of the municipality's ongoing commitment to improving service delivery and enhancing the quality of life for residents within the community. The first project

involves the rehabilitation of Relebogile Street, covering a distance of 700 meters. The scope of work includes the removal of the existing top surface, preparation of the underlying layer, and resurfacing with asphalt. This project is scheduled to be completed within three months and is expected to create temporary employment opportunities for 14 workers.

The second project entails the construction of Ben Matsoma Street, spanning 525 meters. This new road will feature 80mm paving blocks, the installation of V drains to improve


stormwater management, as well as road signage, markings, and speed humps to ensure safety and traffic regulation. Mayor Mokgetle underscored the importance of delivering high-quality workmanship and adhering to the project timelines to ensure these infrastructure improvements meet the expectations of the Marapong community.

These initiatives reflect the municipality's dedication to fostering sustainable development and improving access within the township.

# UPDATE AUTOOSTYD UOE SLOVOI RDP HOUSING PROJECT

#### 01 August 2025

The Altoostyd (Joe Slovo) Integrated Human Settlement Project is a comprehensive mixed-use housing initiative designed to provide secure tenure and improved living conditions for lowincome residents relocated from the former Marapong hostel.

This development entails the construction of two hundred housing units, in the first phase, with the work allocated equally between two contractors, each responsible for one hundred units. The project aligns with the government's constitutional mandate under section 25 to ensure adequate housing for all citizens.

Construction has reached 59% completion, with foundations, wall plates, and related structural elements finalized. All two hundred beneficiary households have been identified, verified, and approved to receive housing within this development.

The primary objective of the project is to meet the housing needs of low-income individuals who were temporarily accommodated at the Altoostyd (Joe Slovo) Temporary Residential Area. These residents previously lacked access to formal private rental markets and social housing opportunities. This project represents a critical step towards providing them with dignified, secure, and sustainable housing solutions.

### ABLUSION FACILITIES PROJECT PROGRESS

### 06 August 2025


The Altoostyd (Joe Slovo) ablution facilities project is approaching its final stages, marking substantial progress in enhancing access to essential sanitation services within the community.

Project Overview and Current Status:

- Facility Allocation: The project comprises four ablution units, including two newly constructed container units and two refurbished container units.
- New Containers: Both new container units have been fully connected to services and are operational. To date, one unit has been officially handed over and is actively serving the community.
- Refurbished Containers: The two refurbished containers are complete and presently pending the installation of solar-powered lighting, which will finalize their functionality and improve safety.

The completion of this project is a vital step in supporting government initiatives aimed at improving housing and sanitation conditions in informal settlements. By providing safe, reliable ablution facilities, this effort contributes significantly to promoting public health and enhancing the quality of life for residents in Altoostyd.







# UPDATE: REFURBISHMENT OF THABO MBEKI IREUBEN MOGASHOAI STADIUM





# PROGRESS UPDATE: REFURBISHMENT AND UPGRADING OF SEWER PUMP STATIONS, WASTE WATER TREATMENT WORKS, NETWORK PIPES AND REPLACEMENT OF SEWER PIPES

### 06 AUGUST 2025

Significant progress has been achieved in the ongoing sewer pump station refurbishment and upgrading project, with 92% of the work now complete. This critical infrastructure initiative involves the replacement of aging asbestos cement and vitreous clay pipes, along with associated fittings, in key areas including Lephalale Town, Onverwacht, and Marapong Township. Rigorous quality control measures have been implemented throughout to ensure that all activities meet the highest standards and specifications.

The primary objective of this project is to enhance wastewater management by replacing deteriorated piping systems and upgrading essential infrastructure to prevent sewer-related failures and associated public health risks. Ultimately, the project aims to improve the overall quality of life for residents by providing a reliable, well-maintained sewage management system.

Key project activities include:

- Replacement of asbestos cement and vitreous clay pipes with modern materials to eliminate leaks and reduce system vulnerabilities.
- Upgrades to sewer pump stations, entailing the replacement of suction pipes, installation of missing pumps and motors, and comprehensive restoration of pump station facilities to optimize operational efficiency.

These efforts reflect a steadfast commitment to prioritizing effective and sustainable sewage system management. The successful completion of this project will enhance public health and safety, mitigate the environmental impact of wastewater disposal, and contribute significantly to resolving longstanding sanitation challenges while promoting the well-being and prosperity of the local community.





# MAYORAL IMBIZO

07 August 2025

The Lephalale Local Municipality convened a Mayoral Imbizo on 7 August 2025 at the Reabetswe Village sports grounds. 

# UPDATE: SEFITLHOGO ACCESS ROAD PROJECT PROGRESS

08 AUGUST 2025

Lephalale Local Municipality is advancing steadily with the Sefithlogo Access Road Project, a key initiative aimed at enhancing the road infrastructure within Lephalale. Currently, the project has reached 65% completion and involves several critical construction phases.

The scope of work includes extensive mass earthworks and hard rock blasting to prepare the site for subsequent road construction. Following this, layered construction activities are underway to establish a robust and stable road foundation. These layers comprise the redbed, selected material, sub-base, and base layers.


Notably, stabilisation of the base layer is being carefully implemented to ensure the longevity and durability of the road.

In addition, the project includes the application of hot-mix asphalt surfacing, which will deliver a smooth and resilient driving surface for the community.

Complementary to this, the installation of culverts, drains, and kerbs is progressing to effectively manage water runoff and enhance road safety. To further improve safety and navigation, the project will incorporate clearly marked road signs and pavement markings, thereby increasing visibility for all road users

This project is aligned with the municipality's broader strategic objectives to improve connectivity and stimulate economic development in the municipality. The upgrade to the access road infrastructure is expected to have significant positive impact on local mobility, community wellbeing, and economic activities. The municipality remains committed to completing this vital infrastructure project efficiently and to the highest standards.









# EXCITING UPDATE ON THE ACCESS ROAD PROJECT IN MARAPONG!




implementation to ensure that all initiatives are completed within the designated timeframe.











# INTRODUCTION OF CONTRACTOR FOR LETLORA ACCESS ROAD

The project in partnership with the NHBRC and local contractors, this initiative is all about empowering women to lead, build, and grow in the economy.






# UPDATE: PROGRESS UNDERWAY ON SHONGOANE 1 ACCESS ROAD REHABILITATION PROJECT

# LEPHALALE MUNICIPALITY SUCCESSFULLY BRINGS PUMPSTATION 30 BACK TO OPERATION




#### 02 September 2025

### 04 September 2025





# OF TWO MAJOR INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS IN MARAPONG TOWNSHIP

#### **16 SEPTEMBER 2025**

On 16 September 2025, the Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, Councillor Aaron Mokgetle, officially announced the commencement of two significant water and sanitation infrastructure projects in Marapong Township. This announcement was made during a community engagement meeting held at the Marapong Library, underscoring the municipality's commitment to enhancing local infrastructure and improving the quality of life for residents.

The first project entails the replacement of the existing asbestos cement (AC) water pipes in Marapong Zone 2 with state-of-the-art high-density polyethylene (HDPE) and unplasticized polyvinyl chloride (uPVC) pipelines. This critical initiative addresses public health concerns by eliminating hazardous materials and ensures the provision of a reliable and safe water supply to the community.

The second project involves the comprehensive upgrade of the bulk water and sewer systems in support of the ongoing Community Residential Units (CRU) development. Key components include the construction of a bulk water pipeline, a 3 megalitre reservoir, electrification of the reservoir site, and the installation of a sewer outfall line connecting the CRU to the closest pump station. Both projects are expected to be completed within an eight-month timeframe.

They will stimulate local economic growth by creating job opportunities and facilitating skills development, thereby promoting community empowerment alongside infrastructure modernization. 
The Lephalale Municipality, in partnership with the Department of Health, announced the launch of the 2025 Oral Health Campaign, currently that took place at Marapong Library. This important initiative is designed to enhance public access to essential health services by promoting improved oral hygiene and overall health within the community.

By focusing on education and preventive measures, the campaign seeks to empower residents with the knowledge and tools necessary to maintain good health. The outreach program aims to serve approximately 700 individuals throughout the Waterberg District, targeting children attending creches, learners in primary schools, and members of the wider rural population.

As part of the campaign's comprehensive health focus, a variety of free services will be made available to the public. These include

oral health education and screenings, HIV testing, screening for hypertension (HPT) and diabetes mellitus (DM), as well as mobile clinic services providing general health consultations, among others.

This initiative forms a critical component of the ongoing efforts to ensure accessible, preventative healthcare reaches underserved rural communities. Residents are strongly encouraged to participate and take full advantage of the free health services and educational resources being offered.





# OFFICIAL LAUNCH OF THE TSHUMA MABONE THURSDAYS PROGRAMME

Mayor Mokgetle emphasized the importance of the programme, stating, "This initiative marks a major step forward in our commitment to public safety and the overall quality of life for our residents. Proper and reliable lighting is critical not only for deterring crime but also for enhancing security and accessibility during nighttime hours. Tshuma Mabone Thursdays promotes a proactive approach by encouraging community involvement to report any outages promptly, allowing us to address them swiftly and efficiently."

The programme establishes a dedicated weekly schedule to identify, report, and remedy faults in public lighting infrastructure. By prioritizing ongoing maintenance, the municipality aims to reduce safety risks, improve nighttime visibility, and strengthen residents' confidence in their surroundings.

To facilitate citizen engagement, residents are encouraged to report faulty street or high mast lights via their ward councillors or by contacting the municipality's electricity standby number at 082 770 2399.

"Our success hinges on collaboration between the municipality and the community. Together, we can build a safer, more secure Lephalale through Tshuma Mabone Thursdays," Mayor Mokgetle added. He further reaffirmed the municipality's commitment to effective, responsive service delivery.

### IN LEPHALALE TOWN AND HIGH MAST LIGHTING IN SURROUNDING VILLAGES


Lephalale Local Municipality has achieved a notable milestone in promoting energy efficiency within its rural communities by completing a significant upgrade to street lighting on 18 September 2025. This upgrade involved the installation of 12 high mast lights across multiple villages, enhancing safety and visibility in these areas.

Furthermore, on 18 September 2025, the Municipality formally commenced the retrofitting of 419 streetlights in Lephalale town, replacing traditional lighting with advanced Light Emitting Diode (LED) technology. This effort forms a key component of the Municipality's ongoing Energy Efficiency Project.

To date, LED upgrades have been successfully completed on the following streets: January Lee, Vaalbos, Impala, Palala, Walter Sisulu Drive, and Nelson Mandela Drive. This initiative aims to improve public safety and visibility while simultaneously promoting energy conservation and reducing operational costs. The transition to LED technology is especially significant, as these lights consume approximately 40% less electricity compared to conventional bulbs. This reduction in energy use results in substantial cost savings and a lower carbon footprint for the Municipality.

Additionally, LED bulbs have an extended lifespan, lasting about three years longer than traditional lighting, thereby decreasing maintenance requirements and preserving municipal resources. This project reflects the Municipality's strong commitment to developing a greener, smarter, and more sustainable Lephalale for the benefit of both current residents and future generations. Through these measures, the Municipality is leading the way toward a brighter and more energy-efficient future.
