05 JANUARY 2025

The Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, CIIr A a r o n M o k g e t I e , participated in the search effort for the missing child who was swept away by the Phalala River on January 1, 2025, in Ga-Seleka village on January 5

The Mayor gathered with numerous community members from Seleka at the banks of the Phalala River, accompanied by Kgosi Seleka, Ward 12 Cllr Abel Mothoni, and Archbishops Abraham Mabula and Issac Motsuki

The Mayor and his entourage began the day by visiting the Maropola family in Ga-Seleka village, where a young boy has went missing after being swept away with a friend by the Phalala River on January 1, 2025

In a message of support to the two families, Archbishop A b r a h a m M a b u I a referenced 1 Thessalonians 5v15-17, stating, "Ensure that no one retaliates with harm, but constantly aim to do good for one another and for all people."

The entourage also met with the Lefawane family in Ga-Seleka, where a young boy tragically drowned after being carried off by the Phalala river earlier this year

The Mayor stated that "we come to express our condolences to the family and to extend the municipality's deepest respect and sympathy."

He also assured the family that the municipality would help them in any way possible during their time of need.

The family appreciated with gratitude the efforts by the Municipality in their time of need.

Jan Monare who was a learner at Ditheko Primary School and his friend Thapelo Maropola were swept away by the Phalala River on 1 January 2025.

The body of 11 year old Jan, was retrieved from the river while the search for Thapelo continues.

The entourage began with a courtesy visit to Kgosi Shongoane Royal House.





MAYOR MEETS WITH DISASTER MANAGEMENT TEAM







14 JANUARY 2025

The Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality met with the disaster management team at Thabo Mbeki Hall, one of the evacuation centres, on 14 January

The purpose of the meeting was to obtain a clear and concise evaluation from the team regarding the ongoing floods caused by the persistent rainfall affecting different areas of Lephalale. The Local Municipality has set up evacuation centres to provide shelter for residents affected by the floods.

At least 136 families from Thabo Mbeki township have been impacted. The evacuation centres designated for the affected families are Shongoane Community Hall, Mokuruanyane Multipurpose Center, and Thabo Mbeki Hall

The Disaster Management team includes officials from the Municipality, South African Social Security Agency (SASSA), Social Development Department, and Ward 5 Councillor Louisa Shongwe. Disaster Management Officials are actively monitoring the situation. The community will be updated about Evacuation Centers in case of flooding in other regions.

After the assessment meeting with the Disaster Management team, the Mayor took the opportunity to address the families affected by the floods, assuring them of the Municipality's dedication to support and assist them

He emphasized the municipality's commitment to making certain that the evacuation centers housing the displaced individuals provide adequate security and a higher quality of living, guaranteeing sufficient food supplies, sanitation facilities, water, and beds with blankets.

He also paid a visit to Mrs. Kgabo Senona's family in Tshelammake, who are also impacted by the flooding.

15 JANUARY 2025

The Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, Cllr Aaron Mokgetle, alongside the Chief Whip of Council, Cllr Joseph Machaba, and Cllrs JD Nel and Sybil Nieuwoudt, visited Ditheku Primary School in the Marapong Township to oversee the reopening of schools, on 15 January 2025.

The purpose of the visit was to evaluate the preparedness of the primary school and to identify solutions to the issues that schools

typically encounter at the beginning of the academic year.

During their visit, the group took the opportunity to introduce the contractor appointed for Marapong bulk water supply project.

The contractor's introduction has been received positively by the Marapong community. The project is expected to be completed within a ten months period, with the actual construction starting in early February.

Deputy Minister of Mineral and Petroleum Resources, Ms Phumzile McGina together with the Limpopo MEC for Education, Ms. Mavhungu Lerule-Ramakhanya, officially opened a modern school hall and four fully equipped classrooms at Nelsonskop Primary School on January 17, 2025.

This initiative, undertaken by Grootegeluk Coal Mine and managed by Exxaro, is in line with Exxaro's strategy for sustainable development and positive impact, as it helps create an environment that supports effective teaching and learning in early education, thus ensuring a brighter future for our children.

The distinguished gathering included the executive Mayor of the Waterberg District Municipality, Cllr Jack Maeko, the Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, Cllr Aaron Mokgetlhe, municipal councillors, EXXARO General Manager, officials, representatives

from the Mineral and Energy Department, and district and circuit officials from the Department of Education.

During the ceremony, Cllr Aaron Mokgetle, the Mayor of Lephalale Local Municipality, stated that initiatives like these should always be embraced, particularly when they reflect the District Development Model aimed at speeding up, aligning, and integrating service delivery under a unified development strategy.

The newly constructed school hall, which includes 320 chairs and classrooms, will create a supportive learning atmosphere for the pupils of Nelsonskop Primary School

PROVINCIAL OVERSIGHT VISIT TO FLOOD-AFFECTED AREAS IN LEPHANCE







21 JANUARY 2025

The Limpopo MEC for Cooperative Governance, Human Settlement and Traditional Affairs (CoGHSTA), Mr. Basikopo Makamu, along with Health MEC, Ms. Dieketseng Mashego, the Acting Executive Mayor of Waterberg District Municipality, Cllr Dipuo Moatshe, and Lephalale Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr Aaron Mokgetle, together with the Disaster Management Team, have on 21 January 2025, embarked on a day-long Provincial Oversight Visit to areas affected by the recent disastrous flooding in Lephalale.

The group began their day with a briefing at the Municipality, which was followed by an on-site evaluation at the D1836 in Witkop to assess the damage inflicted by the heavy rainfall.

The team then moved on to the Tambotie River Bridge and Witpoort Hospital, where they carried out a walkabout to assess the extent of the destruction caused by the recent severe rains and flooding.

They wrapped up their activities at Thabo Mbeki Township, where they

toured the residential area and held individual sessions with members of the impacted communities.

In his comments, MEC Makamu stated that the Waterberg District has been severely impacted by the floods, which resulted in infrastructure damage and displaced families. He mentioned that his office, along with the Lephalale Local Municipality, will formulate a plan to permanently relocate families whose homes are situated near the banks of the Palala River to prevent future flood-related damage.

He expressed appreciation for the efforts of the Local Disaster Management Team, Gift of the Givers, SAPS, Red Cross, and all relevant departments for their dedication and contributions, which included food parcels, toiletries, and other essential items.

Included in the group were the Speaker of Council, Cllr Grace Marakalala, Chief Whip, Cllr Joseph Machaba, EXCO Member, Cllr Ratah Modiba, as well as Municipal Councillors and representatives from different sector departments.

CELAN-UP CAMPAGEN CELAN-UP CAMP

The service delivery team of Lephalale Local Municipality has launched a three-day clean-up initiative targeting Onverwacht and Lephalale Town starting on 21 January 2025.

The team from the Municipal Waste Management division cleaned streets and public areas in Onverwacht and Town. Streets included are Walter Sisulu, Nelson Mandela Road, Chris Hani, the industrial zone, the front section of Mahlakung informal settlement, Jan Lee, Ring Road, Shoprite Rank, OR Tambo Road, and the CBD.

Herman and Wells Streets, as well as sections along Nelson Mandela road.

The initiative persisted on 22 January 2025, as the Municipal waste and parks teams carried on with their cleaning efforts, which were focused on, among other objectives, addressing littering and the unlawful disposal of waste in Onverwacht and Lephalale Town.

Municipal officials, along with participants from the Expanded Public Works Programme (EPWP), initiated litter collection and grass trimming along OR Tambo, Nelson Mandela, Walter Sisulu, Wells, Herman, Emco and Magnolia shopping complex, Fox Odendaal, Ring road, Troupant, and Palala Streets.

23 JANUARY 2025



The group wrapped up the program by visiting the Martin's Drift Boader Post which links South Africa and Botswana.










COMMUNITY WELCOMES CONTRACTOR FOR STADIUM REFURBISHMENT

The workshop further offered members an opportunity to swap enhanced methods for their monthly reporting by sharing insights and collaborating on strategies to tackle challenges.










SECOND INTEGRATED DEVELOPMENT PLAN




MUNICIPAL AND TRADITIONAL COUNCILS

WELDOMES PRESENTATION ON RENEWABLE ENERGY







18 FEBRUARY 2025

Three local traditional authorities, expressed their appreciation for the presentation on renewable energy by investors The presentation conducted at the Municipal council chamber on 18 February was aimed to establish new collaborative relationships within the municipal boundaries.

The innovative solar power facility will support the municipality by decreasing the demand on the electricity grid, supplying residents of Lephalale with adequate power. This initiative is considered a vital move forward in addressing energy issues for future generations, formulating strategies and linking sustainable efforts by enhancing development aimed at tackling these challenges.

In his statements, Lephalale Local Municipality Mayor, Cllr Aaron Mokgetle, strongly highlighted the importance of transformative projects that tackle challenges facing the municipality, emphasizing that all initiatives aimed at resolving these issues and improving service delivery will be warmly received.

The solar power facility which will be located between Lephalale town and Marapong and will have a capacity of 315 MW.

A consensus among the municipal council and the traditional authorities was that the project's implementation would contribute towards alleviating the unemployment problems currently faced in Lephalale.

FOR WATER PROJECTS AND THE ASSESSMENT AND COMPILATION OF THE TECHNICAL REPORT

FOR MP TOLLETS AT MARIOUS MUAGES

21 FEBRUARY 2025

In order to expedite service delivery, Lephalale Local Municipality Speaker Cllr Grace Marakalala, alongwith other Councillors and officials, initiated project handover meetings with the three traditional authorities at Ga-Seleka, Mokuruanyane, and Shongoane villages on 20 February 2025.

The meetings sought to introduce different service providers assigned to assess and create a technical report, along with planning, design, project management, and commissioning for the Ga-seleka Water Scheme, to evaluate and compile a technical report for the Shongoane Water Scheme, to perform an assessment and prepare a technical report for VIP Toilets and Backlog Verification in rural areas, and to construct the Mokuruanyane and Shongoane Regional Water Scheme Project Phase 5, which aims to revive a stalled project dating back to the 2015/2016 financial year.

The VIP sanitation initiative will be carried out in every rural village to eliminate the backlog. The community will receive ventilated improved pit latrines that can be maintained, and a fecal sludge treatment facility will be built at a central location to collect all the fecal sludge produced by different villages.

The Technical reports for the Ga-Seleka and Shongoane Water Schemes will include the work scope for ensuring sufficient water supply to rural communities.

Communities will gain advantages as field workers will be assigned to the VIP project to gather backlog verification data. The Mokuruanyane and Shongoane Regional Water Scheme initiatives will generate roughly 50 employment opportunities for the local community in the villages where the projects are set to be carried out

The evaluation report for the VIP restrooms will include the technical solutions for a secure.





MPAC PRESENTATION ON THE 2023/24 ANNUAL REPORT

Lephalale Local Municipality conducted the Municipal Public Accounts Committee (MPAC) public participation on 26 February 2025 at the Roman Catholic Church in Lephalale town.








HANDING OVER OF ICT EQUIPMENT AT

15 FEBRUARY 2025 - DAY 1


