



Traffic Management Division

Appointment and powers vested upon Traffic Officers derive from the national road traffic act (Act No. 93 of 1996), and the declaration as peace officers under section 334 (1) (a) of the criminal procedure act (Act No. 51 of 1977). The two legislation empowers the traffic officers in the execution of their responsibilities in ensuring that the public roads are safe, secured and accident-free environment. The traffic service provision is mainly concentrated and dedicated to the Municipal road network within the jurisdictional area of Lephalale local municipality. Lephalale municipal traffic officers strive to serve the community with dignity, courtesy, integrity, openness and adhere to the Batho pele principles.
